Classroom Comments Prep

Students have been enjoying hands on Maths rotations both outside in the courtyard and in the classroom. They have had so much fun exploring length by racing match box cars through tunnels and sequencing a variety of objects from longest to shortest. We have explored volume in the sandpit and surface area with leaves and blocks. They have even used pool noodles to make clock hands to show o'clock times. It is great to see the students so engaged in play based learning.

The sight word identification in the Prep Class is explosive! The children are focused and they are all doing their best. This week we have been applying our sight word and phonics to write words and sentences together. This is a tough task as so many skills are involved. The students are becoming comfortable in sounding out words and writing down each sound. We are still focusing on the following reading strategies; stretchy snake (sound out the word), Chunky monkey (identify small words or known word endings to help figure out the word) and lips the fish (get your lips ready to say the word. of course retelling the story in sequenced detail is also a consistent activity the children participate in.

We look forward to our second senior class buddy 'Oral Book Club' session this Friday as the seniors will be working with their prep buddy revising reading strategies by using a story book of their own. This is always very exciting for the Prep children and a great way for them to practise talking to older students while building a positive friendship.

Thank you to all of the parents who came to our Hinterland Athletics Carnival, the children had a great time and were super excited that their families were watching.
